## Call to worship

## Call to Confession

Anyone who is in Christ is a new creation. The old life has gone; a new life has begun. Know that you are forgiven and be at peace. Amen.

*Savior God, guide us by your Word and Spirit that we might hear your truth, heed your call and be prepared for Christ's coming this Christmas. Amen.*

God of our salvation, **hear our prayers.**


As the days grow short and the nights loom long, we praise you for
